I am pleased to inform you that the Expert Committee constituted by the Ministry of Culture, Government of India based on the proposal submitted by you, has selected you for award of Junior Fellowship for the batch year 2020-21 in the field of Visual Art, Sub-Field Paintingfor a period of two years with effect from 01-07-2023. The value of the Fellowship will be Rs. 10,000/- per month and the same will be released in 4 six-monthly instalments as per present provisions.

The Centre for Culmral Resources and Training (CCRT) will require a six-monthly Progress Report as per the schedule overleaf. The first and the second instalments of Fellowship will be released on the receipt of 1st and 2st six monthly Progress Report, respectively. The third instalment will be released after review of progress of your 1st and 2st six-monthly progress reports by an Expert Committee and after the receipt of your 3st six-monthly progress report. On completion of the Project, one hard bound copy of 2 years' complete Project document will have to be submitted to CCRT. The fourth instalment will be released after the 4st six-monthly progress report and the hard bounded copy of the complete Project document are received in hard as well as soft copy and evaluated by the designated Expert Committee. The last date for submission of the complete Project Report is 31st July, 2025. However, in exceptional circumstances extension of time by maximum three months will be permissible without any additional financial liability to the Government of India/MoC/CCRT subject to approval of the Competent Authority.

The six-monthly progress reports should contain details of the research work done by you during the relevant period of six months, and in addition it should also contain evidence of your work, which may be in the form of Photographs, Press Reviews, Survey work, etc. The detailed guidelines of the same will be communicated to you and will also be uploaded on CCRT's as well as MoC's website in during the communicated to you and will also be uploaded on CCRT's as well as MoC's website in during the communicated to you and will also be uploaded on CCRT's as well as MoC's website in during the communication.

It may please be noted that the Government of India/Ministry of Culture reserves the right to discontinue the grant of the Fellowship at any time if and when after review/enquiries, etc. Ministry of Culture comes to the conclusion that you have either abandoned the Project work or are not pursuing this work seriously.

You are also required to send the proof of leave from your organization if you are regularly working in a Government /State Department/University/Establishment/Institute, etc. The Fellowship is liable to be cancelled in ease the proof of leave is not sent.
